

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).

This is a very familiar and comforting promise from the Lord. I recently preached on it! It was part of the Lord's letter to the exiles who were facing a very uncertain future, and He wanted them to know that He was already setting in motion the plans for their future.

For several years Dede and I have been seeking the Lord's plans for us following my retirement. We knew for certain that we wanted to move closer to the Camden area to eliminate Dede's commute and give her back 90 minutes of each workday. But the "where" and the "when" of that plan were uncertain. All along, we prayed for the Lord to guide every detail of the plan. We asked Him to open and close doors as appropriate, so our plan would be in perfect harmony with His plan.

Several years ago we met Pastor Brent Miller and his family, of First Baptist Church of Collingswood. We have developed a close friendship and have visited the congregation many times since then. We felt strongly that this was God's way of helping us find our next church home after I retire. Finding a new church home was the top priority for us, so we feel at peace now that God has supplied it.

After much thought and prayer we decided to look for an apartment and found a complex we liked near Collingswood. We settled on a particular apartment model with a loft, and began praying for one to become available at the right time. Next it was time to consult our real estate agent to plan for selling our home.

Initially, we planned to list our home next spring, but we soon found that the Lord had a different plan. Our agent asked us to consider listing the house this fall but I told her we had no place to go. Within a few days I called the apartment complex and found that an apartment with the exact model we prefer was going to be available on November 15th. Hearing this, Dede and I both felt the Lord was providing a place for us to go—and that we should put the house on the market as soon as possible.

For us this has been a reminder that if we leave the plan and the timing up to the Lord, He will guide us and provide all that is needed. We need to let the Lord devise and implement the plan. So, 9 Hylton Road is now for sale! We had our first open house on September 22nd and several other showings are scheduled. We appreciate your prayers for the sale of our house—in God's timing, of course.

Obviously this means we will be moving sometime before I retire on April 30th. That said, I want to assure you, as I have the Leadership Community, that I will be available to carry out all my present ministry responsibilities. Instead of a 12 minute drive to church it will be about 30 minutes, but I pledge to do whatever is necessary to continue to serve First Baptist Church faithfully until I retire.

plastic shoeboxes will be available for you to use. Also, see suggestions in future bulletins. "This is a powerful tool for evangelism and discipleship...to grow the Kingdom of God even in places where the Gospel has never been heard" (Samaritan's Purse website).

Why \$9 Shipping Cost?

The \$9 per shoebox gift is critical for Operation Christmas Child. It covers the cost of transporting the shoeboxes to eight different processing centers. At the eight processing center warehouses the shoeboxes are secured and prepared for international shipment. Millions of shoeboxes are transported by ships, trucks, and airplanes to the countries where they will be distributed. Also, the fee helps to train and equip local churches to use a Ministry Partner Guide which shows churches how to share the Good News in a child-friendly way. Your donation also provides The Greatest Gift Gospel booklets which are written in the children's native language.
