

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, ... (1 Peter 3:15).

There I was, minding my own business eating my lunch at the Swedesboro Diner on Ash Wednesday. I was seated in the back next to the small lunch counter reading the newspaper and I couldn't help hearing a conversation between a man in his 30s and a

waitress. "It's Ash Wednesday, did you go to church to get ashes?" he asked. The question launched them into a discussion on whether God really exists.

While they were both extremely skeptical the man expressed an openness to believe if someone could offer sufficient proof. He seemed conflicted, stating his disbelief but then saying, "I'd really like to believe." He declared himself an agnostic—one who believes God may exist but is unknowable. This caught my attention since he did not say he was an atheist. This man was a seeker! He was hoping to find hope.

Finishing my dessert I knew I had to give him some hope, not because I'm a pastor, but simply because I'm a disciple of Jesus, "prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks me to give a reason for the hope I have" (technically, he didn't ask me but the Spirit nudged me). So I walked over to speak to him. "Excuse me, I hope I'm not being too nosy, but I overheard your conversation and it seems you're open to know if there is a God." Thankfully, he received me warmly. I then suggested the man consider reading two books that would address his questions about God: *The Reason for God*, by Tim Keller and *The Case for Christ*, by Lee Strobel. He immediately searched both books on his iPad, proving he was indeed open to consider the existence of God. He then thanked me for my suggestions. I told him the books would answer most of his questions, wished him well, and went on my way.

It's funny because I really wanted to be seated in a larger booth to be able to read the newspaper more comfortably, but God had a reason for seating me where He did! It was another unexpected opportunity to point someone to the Living God, and when the opportunities arise we need to be ready. I planted the seed and now I'll pray for this man whose name I don't know. No problem, God knows him and knows exactly what he needs—and I believe God will steer others into his path to help him find his way home to Jesus.

Well, this is my last newsletter message to you, my dear friends in Christ, and it's fitting that it's a story of reaching out to share the Good News of Christ because that has been the focus of my ministry for many years. God called me as your pastor to help you begin to live into your mission statement: *To birth and develop mature disciples of Jesus Christ characterized by faith, hope and love.* By God's grace we have moved closer to that goal but much of the necessary work remains unfinished.

In the future I pray that all of you will make a commitment to always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have in Christ Jesus
